#### 8. RECOGNITION/PRESENTATION

- 8.1 <u>Student Reports</u> An eighth grader from Spratling Middle School approached the podium, introduced himself and began to share with the board meeting attendees recent and upcoming events and activities at SMS. The student shared that the spring dance was a success and they had about 75 students attend. The first spring rally was a great success involving games like: Human Hungry, Hungry Hippos, balloon races, and more. Everyone is looking forward to the second spring rally on April 18 and also the egg hunt.
- **8.2** Staff Reports The Board of Trustees has received written reports by staff. At this time, we would like invite the board to ask questions they might have of management and administrative team.

President Jeff Reed asked KTL Charter Director Rusty Wynn for some clarification about the enrollment reporting sections of his board report. There was some confusion about Independent Study and High School numbers being low, while there was a lottery held for K-6- although they are currently in decline enrollment. Mr. Wynn and KTL Charter Secretary Betty Jo Nascimento, whom was in the audience, explained that they do not have a final or firm count for Independent Study and High School for 2019-20 and those number will continue to change, while, K-6 is on a waitlist. However, we do not wish to expand quantity of students in classrooms and risk quality of education.

**Recognition** – 2018-19 Stanislaus Partners In Education (SPIE) Incentive and Career Education Grant Award Recipients; Charis Caughey, Keyes Elementary School (Incentive Grant), Jill McGinnis, Keyes to Learning Charter (Incentive Grant), & Kim Mattos, Keyes to Learning Charter (Career Education Grant).

Superintendent Brasil explained that Stanislaus Partners in Education (SPIE) reached out to the District and expressed appreciation for what quality applications came from our teachers. I want to take this time to thank the teachers within our district for taking it upon themselves to apply for these grants and to thank them for the quality of work they put into the application in representing our district. Thank you and thank you for being here tonight. At this time, I would like to invite each of them up to the podium to share a little bit about what they were able to do with the grant and how it is impacting our students.

Ms. (Charis) Caughey, a 3<sup>rd</sup> grade teacher at Keyes Elementary School introduced herself and expressed gratitude for SPIE reward system; She explained she is a firm believer in positive reinforcements and that we want to strive for students to be their best. She displayed some colored paper made into "Caughey Bucks" that students would receive for various positive behaviors in the classroom and then

could be redeemed once they reach a certain value. In addition to rewarding students for positive behaviors and actions, this also teaches them great life skills, such as the value of money, how to save, etc.

Ms. (Jill) McGinnis, a Kindergarten teacher at Keyes to Learning Charter School, explained that she received the SPIE incentive grant. The money was used to hold "Math Madness" event on Pi day and also to buy pies for the attendees on that day.

Ms. (Kim) Mattos, a 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher at Keyes to Learning Charter School, whom received a \$500 Career Education Grant explained that she teaches Leadership Academy for 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade students. The grant money was used to take career and education field trip to Franz Nursery and Hilmar Cheese Company. The students will be receiving a tour, grafting lesson, and tour of the zebras; at Hilmar Cheese Company, they will be eating lunch, a mini-presentation of the industry and jobs associated with Hilmar Cheese, and also a cheese making class.



Our current district enrollment is 1110 students, and 335 at the charter. We are once again holding Kindergarten registration in hopes to increase enrollment. The CSEA/KTA negotiations went well and I appreciate the cooperation and trust. LCAP continues to be worked on; we have distributed forms to parents and staff and are awaiting feedback. The KTL charter construction project is going very well- and seems to be on schedules. The roofing project at KES will begin during Spring Break and will continue with the larger projects during summer to be fully completed by the beginning of the 2019-20 school year.

We had the board member walk-thru and they went very well. We were able to see some of KTL's Talent show – they did a skit with boys standing behind the girls applying makeup for them that was very funny. The wrestling season for SMS had wrapped up and they did very well-I had lunch with them and thanked them for all of their dedication and hard work – they were great and so gracious. State testing will take place after Spring Break.
